



In Memoriam

Francis L. Berkeley, Jr.



The Thomas Jefferson Foundation lost a great friend and leader when Francis L. Berkeley, Jr., died Feb. 19 at his home in Charlottesville. He was 91.

Frank Berkeley served on the Board of Governors of the Thomas Jefferson Memorial Foundation starting in 1951 and was an active member and officer of the Board of Trustees from 1964 to 1982, when he was named an Honorary Trustee. He was particularly proud of his role in many key decisions, including the hiring of Daniel P. Jordan, the acquisition of the Shadwell and Tufton properties, and the support of Dumas Malone's landmark biography of Thomas Jefferson.

In April 2002, Mr. Berkeley attended the dedication of the Jefferson Library and saw the unveiling of his portrait in the conference room named in his honor.

Mr. Berkeley will be remembered at Monticello for his keen mind, high standards, and stalwart support of the Jeffersonian legacy, and he will be missed.
