

## Handy now chairman of Board of Trustees

ALICE W. HANDY of Charlottesville has begun serving as chairman of the Thomas Jefferson Foundation Board of Trustees. Her two-year term began Jan. 1.

Handy, most recently the board's vice chairman and treasurer, is the successor to Jeffrey C. Walker of New York, who had served as chairman since April 2005. Walker remains on the board as a vice chairman.

Succeeding Handy as vice chairman and treasurer is Howard P. Milstein of New York, a trustee since 2006. Mrs. Luella Davis of Greens Farms, Conn., continues as board secretary, a position she has held since 2005.

"Jeff Walker was a superior chairman, and we're pleased he is staying on as a board officer," said Daniel P. Jordan, the Foundation's president. "We are truly fortunate to have Alice Handy as his successor. Her talents, experience, and spirit

will be tremendous assets in advancing our mission during this important stage of Monticello's history."

Handy joined the TJF board in 1999, began serving as secretary in 2004, and was named vice chairman and treasurer in 2005. She is the founder and president of Investure, a private investment firm based in Charlottesville. Prior to founding Investure, she spent 29 years managing the endowment for the University of Virginia, as investment officer, treasurer, and finally president of the University of Virginia Investment Management Company. A graduate of Connecticut College, she began her career as a bond portfolio manager and assistant vice president at the Travelers Insurance Co. She also served as state treasurer of Virginia from October 1988 to January 1990.

Also at the start of this year, David R.

Goode of Norfolk and Roger Hertog of New York began four-year terms as TJF trustees.

Goode is the retired chairman, president, and chief executive officer of Norfolk Southern Corp. A graduate of Duke University and Harvard Law School, he is member of the board of directors of Delta Air Lines, Inc., and other corporations and a trustee of the Chrysler Museum of Art.

Hertog is vice chairman emeritus of AllianceBernstein L.P., a global asset management firm with offices in 25 countries. A graduate of the City College of New York, he is chairman of the New-York Historical Society and a trustee of the New York Public Library and other institutions.

Leaving the board Dec. 31 was Alfonso L. Carney, Jr., of New York, a TJF trustee since 2000.
