What ages do Monticello Summer Adventures serve?

Rising 3rd graders through rising 7th graders
(Rising 3rd graders must be 8 years old by next September)

When are Monticello Summer Adventures offered?

8:30 a.m. – 12:00 noon, Monday – Friday on the following dates:

- June 19 – 23, 2017
- June 26 – 30, 2017
- July 10 – 14, 2017

What are Monticello Summer Adventures like? What activities do you offer?

Surrounded by the spectacular setting of Monticello, campers explore Thomas Jefferson’s world and his legacy today. Activities take participants both indoors and outdoors and typically include archaeology, exploring the gardens, cooking historic foods, hiking the grounds, solving puzzles, building and creating, playing games, and a special tour of the Monticello mansion. In the words of one camper, “It’s AWESOME!”

Do you provide snack?

We provide a snack daily. If your child has food allergies, we encourage you to send a comparable snack if needed.

How many children per session?

Enrollment is limited to 16 participants per session.

Who are the counselors?

Monticello Summer Adventures are led by friendly and professional Monticello guides, with assistance from youth volunteers. With two adult instructors for each session, children receive plenty of personal attention.

When does registration open?

Registration will open February 15.
